1. Membership recruitment and retention to accomplish a net increase in membership.

36 Lodges had a net increase in membership. This is an increase over 2005, when 31 Lodges had a net increase.

25 Lodges will receive the Founder's Award for a 3% net increase in membership. This is an increase of 2 from 2005.

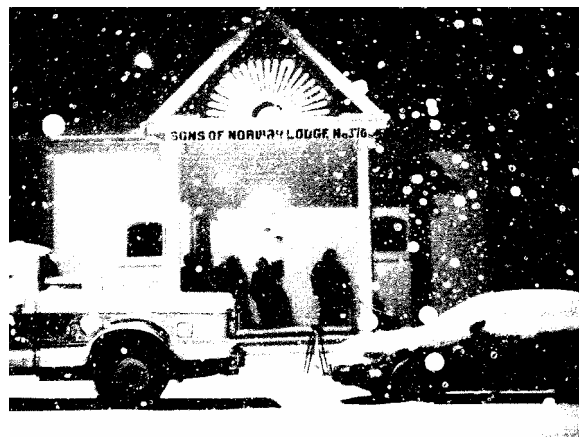
We ended 2006 with 13,070 adult and juvenile members, a decrease of 123 over 2005; however, in 2005 we lost over 500 adult and juvenile members.

Congratulations to all the Lodges that showed an increase and those who will receive Founder's Awards. I might add that 5 Lodges did not show an increase or decrease for 2006.

Membership Assistance Guidelines for 2007 have changed and are elsewhere in the *Posten*. Many Lodges have already applied for MAP grants.

District 1 Goals 2006-2008—Approved Oct. 28, 2006

1. Membership recruitment and retention to accomplish a 5% net increase in membership each year.

- Create an online catalogue and information exchange of sports directors and events
- Each Zone will have a sports event

7. Raise the visibility and increase the District 1 Scholarship Trust Fund

- All Lodges that received District Scholarship funds will have a presentation from the recipient
- Raise \$10,000 from Lodges and individual donors
- All Board Members will make an annual contribution

8. Increase awareness of insurance and financial products

- Encourage Financial Benefit Counselors to attend 2 Lodge meeting per year

9. Increase awareness of the Sons of Norway Foundation

Greetings to all District 1 members,

Thank you to all of our new officers for serving your lodge in a very important way and thank you to all outgoing officers for your dedication this past year. We will continue to focus on membership growth and the formation of membership committees in your lodge. Thank you all for the success we had with membership in 2006.

As you know we established a membership committee on the District level in 2006. Our focus has been on organizing and compiling the information we needed to understand our market. This information includes 1) Compiling of the demographic information on our current lodges and the size of the Norwegian

population in them. 2) Compiled the data on potential new lodge locations. We have identified 18 new markets with the size and population of Norwegians to have a successful lodge. Hutchinson MN is now in the early stages of forming a lodge. 3) Developed a new lodge formation manual. 4) Made membership our #1 priority. 5) Recommended to the D1 board that our 07' workshops be dedicated to membership. 6) Held our first teleconference with our Zone Directors. It was very successful and will be done every quarter. 7) Continue to work with D1 lodges to establish membership committees. Continue to emphasize the importance of converting your Financial Sec to Membership Sec. and establishing goals for membership events and mem-

bership activity.

It is so critical that we focus on membership growth. It cannot be emphasized enough that we must continue to build on the momentum we have begun with membership. By planning membership goals and activities I believe we can again show growth in D1.

I have just finished compiling, publishing and mailing the District Lodge #1 Directory for 2007. This is one of the District Secretary's major tasks each year. We publish the Directory to facilitate communications in the District. The information about lodge officers comes from the Fraternal Department which in turn comes from the Report of Officers (D-63) that your local lodge secretary submits in December. I have had a few updates to addresses or phone numbers. Please note that the data I published came from the Home Office which comes from information in their files. You can update your own address, phone and email by going to the Sons of Norway web site (www.sofn.com) or contacting the Fraternal Department.

The timing of the Directory is determined largely by the timing of the D-63. The Home Office compiles the information and sends it to me when all lodges have reported – this year about January 25. I take the data and format and print the officer pages. The Execu-

tive Committee has determined what other content should be included. I also assemble and print that information and then I assemble the entire book and put it in the envelopes on which I printed names and addresses of Lodge Presidents and Secretaries. [This year I had assistance from my eight year old niece with the envelopes.] The manufacturing process takes about two weeks of printing, assembling and mailing.

I would like to know how you use the Directory. If it is just another element in a stack of papers or if it is a key resource, it would help me and the rest of the Executive Committee know how much effort we should put into it. Please suggest changes, especially to the Resources (pink) section.

The directory includes District and International officers for the year and officers reported by the 86 lodges in District 1 (Hovestad Lodge in Pierre, SD has voted to disband) plus contacts for two forming lodges in Houston, Texas and Hutchinson, Minnesota.

Please note the names, addresses and phone numbers in this book are for use in Sons of Norway business. If you have concerns over whether it is permissible to use the address list for something, please check with President Tehven.

If you have a legitimate use for information in this book I can provide it to you in an electronic form or as a print image for mailing labels. **Please email requests to me with the specifics—for example, US Mail addresses for Lodge Editors in South Dakota as a comma delimited file.** Allow one week for delivery in electronic form, 10 days for paper.

I can also provide the entire directory as a PDF file to you or other officers or members in your lodge.

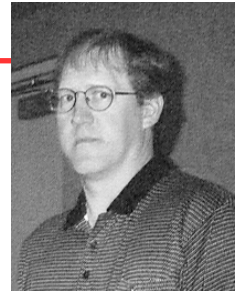
Fra District Sosial Direktor—David Susag

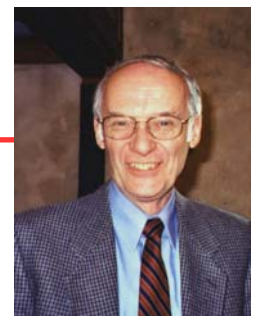

2. Establish new Lodges, re-establish Lodges in former locations, and actively support membership to revitalize Lodges.

Hundrearsjubelium Lodge 1-671, Oklahoma City, was instituted in June 2006 and has grown to over 100 members!

We are in the process of re-establishing a Lodge in Houston, TX and hope to institute it in 2007. And we are actively engaged in Hutchinson, MN to form a new Lodge.

If you have friends or relatives in the Houston or Hutchinson areas, let them know about these new Lodges.

3. Enhance leadership across the District

In 2005 – 2006 we conducted Leadership Workshops throughout the District. The results were that Lodges set goals and achieved them, especially their membership goals!

4. Encourage social and cultural programs

We have established a group of Cultural Skills presenters that are available to help Lodges with their programs, and the District will assist with their expenses. Each Lodge has a roster of these Presenters; however, you can contact the District

5. Encourage Community Visibility

Our Lodges are doing remarkably well making their presence known in their communities, especially through the Adopt A School Program. We currently have over 50 Adopt A School Coordinators who are doing some great things! We just need to hear about them! 6. Promote youth/sports programs

The Scholarship Trust Fund received \$7,279 in gifts from Lodges and individuals in 2006.

What a great way to promote our culture and heritage!

8. Provide Lodges/members information and encouragement to consider SON benefit products in their financial planning.

We did not do as well as we had hoped in accomplishing this goal; however, it is a high priority for 2007.

So, what does all this mean? We had a very good year! Thanks goes to the dedication and leadership in your Lodges, the District 1 Board, and Sons of Norway International. We do not, and cannot, achieve these results by ourselves.

2006 was a very good year. Together we will make 2007 even better!

 - Application/Report forms are found in the back of the District 1 Lodge Directory or at www.sofn-1.com under 'forms'.
 2. Awards will be made on a first come, first served bases, until the 2007 budget of \$4,000.00 is awarded. This means:
 - Conduct your membership event early in the year,
 - Send your Report immediately.
 3. MAP awards will be \$15.00 per recruit, up to 15 new members (not transfers) per Lodge per year.
 4. Lodges may apply for two MAP events per year; however, the maximum MAP award remains at 15 new members, cumulative for the year.
